that I was in Chicago for my first ACHE Congress on Healthcare Leadership. My best friend lived in Chicago several years ago and bestowed tips as I walked around the city that evening, "go here, and check out the ceiling... go there and look up at the building top...look up and out..."



Chicago is renown for its architecture, but this "heads up/look up" mindset perfectly aligned with

this year's Congress theme, "Advance." It is what being a part of ACHE, attending Congress, and a commitment to attaining the FACHE Fellowship credential is all about: looking up with awareness and optimism, looking forward with vision, and looking out for each other as we advance in our careers and care for our communities.

ACHE Congress is the premier annual event dedicated to advancing healthcare leadership. It is also the event where members who pass the Board of Governor's Exam to earn the prestigious FACHE credential are invited to walk in a graduation ceremony to commemorate their achievement.

Advancing forward through the marathon of the pandemic where we are relentlessly "heads down" focused on our patients, organizations, and teams, resuming to in-person connection at Congress was a welcomed change.

ACHE took great care to ensure attendees were cared for and protected, requiring vaccination, enabling social distance visual cues through a red/yellow/green system of colored lanyards, and supplied masks, sanitizer, and onsite testing services.

This year's program offered at least 12 face-to-face CEU hours to choose from over 160 expert faculty-led educational sessions. "Having the ability to talk to real professionals in the field is extremely valuable to students entering the workforce. It's experiences like ACHE Congress that reaffirm my desire to work as a healthcare administrator!" said Brooke Devers, a 2022 University of Scranton MHA Graduate. Gianna Melillo, MPH, LVHN Administrative Fellow agrees. "Congress allowed me to network with many people in healthcare across the country as well as the ability to sit in on enriching learning sessions and learn from some of the best leaders in the industry."

Career development services, poster showcases, vendor booths, and both formal and informal networking events also offered valuable opportunities for earlycareerist and seasoned professionals alike. "Attending Congress as a student associate gave me the opportunity to attend professional advising sessions for resume review and career advising with top leaders in the healthcare field," said Sarah Slusark, a current MHA candidate with the University of Scranton, adding, "the advice, knowledge, and encouragement I received from ACHE members will help me become a successful leader in my future career."

Planning for Diversity, Inclusion and Equity

It finally feels like Spring is here in Pennsylvania with new growth and opportunity everywhere you look. Maybe you're getting ready to watch your senior graduate from high school, or furiously

scrubbing away, finishing up your Spring cleaning, or wrapping up your annual business goals at work. This is the time of year when many of us are getting ready to tackle the new fiscal year and collaborating on the next strategic plan, and while we're ensuring that our strategy and direction are in line with our mission and vision, we often times forget that the communities we serve and represent are diverse and should be included in our strategic plans. A 2020 McKinsey report, which looked at more than 1,000 companies in 15 countries, showed that companies that welcome diversity have a 36% higher likelihood of financially outperforming less diverse companies. Likewise, the Harvard Business Review has published that diverse companies are 70% more likely to expand their market share. So, how do you plan for inclusion? Here are 5 tips to get you started:

1. Representation Matters - Increase diverse and inclusive representation across the board, and most importantly in leadership roles.

2. Lead with Purpose - Strengthen leadership and accountability by developing specific and strategic Diversity, Inclusion, and Equity goals.

3. Learn and Unlearn – Research what other organizations have done for Diversity, Inclusion, and Equity, and learn from them. Provide the tools for dismantling bias while promoting openness and acceptance.

4. Baby Steps – Create mini goals to determine the return on investment from your Diversity, Inclusion, and Equity initiatives. It's ok to start small; you're building stages of growth.

5. Walk the Talk – Incorporate Diversity, Inclusion, and Equity into your outreach goals by ensuring a minimum of 2 questions surrounding Diversity, Inclusion, and Equity are asked during events or included in presentations.
